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COVER ILLUSTRATION: Neal Dow's expansive career as an exponent of prohibition and author of the Maine Law has generated a wealth of biographical literature, sometimes critical, sometimes credulous, but always controversial. On our cover is a birthday tribute to Dow published in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1894. Georgians praised the Maine reformer for his dedication to a nation redeemed from the "tyranny of the rum power." In our first article, William Dawson surveys the literature on this significant Maine figure and indicates new archival resources and new directions for scholarship. Dawson points out that we have much to learn about Dow's place in the history of Maine and the nation.
